And she gave it to me and she said... I said "call the hospital.. try to get through to the hospital" but at that time there was no telephone from there to the hospital. So what she

done... I ran upstairs with the scissors and the thread and ah... she got through or sent her husband, got her husband out of bed and sent him up to the hospital, which wasn't very far, just up...just up over the hill right.

But anyway, they cut the babies cord and fixed it up and all that and ah... Aunt Jane said, I can remember Aunt Jane saying "well now we got to get the afterbirth".
