Marie Marshall:

Never for framing, mostly for on the floor to keep your feet warm.

So that's what it's going to ah.... when it gets finished that's what I'll probably do with it. It will give tourist a kind of idea of how old and ah....how we try to keep it alive by telling about how it was done.

Explain to them how it was done.
